GOT SHEEP? YOUR COYOTES DO!

Coyotes (Canis latrans) are highly adaptable and opportunistic predators that pose a large threat to livestock, particularly sheep. Their high predatory behavior can lead to substantial economic losses for farmers and can disrupt livestock management.

Coyotes are versatile feeders with a diet that varies based on their habitat and the availability of prey. In more rural and agricultural areas, they often target domestic animals such as sheep. They will prey on sheep when the opportunity arises, particularly targeting the vulnerable individuals such as lambs and weakened adults. By using high, durable fencing to create a barrier between coyotes and the sheep. Electric fences can be particularly effective when properly maintained.

When not grazing, keep sheep in secure enclosures or barns to minimize their exposure to coyotes. By understanding coyote behavior and implementing a more comprehensive prevention strategy, sheep farmers can better protect their flocks and minimize the impact of predation on their operations.
