

TREE AND SHRUB CARE

As the heat of summer wains, many trees and shrubs are about to have their crowning fall display. Pruning, mulching, and keeping an eye on the soil can help woody plants remain healthy for years to come.

MULCH is great to have over the roots of trees and shrubs. It cools the soil, helps to retain moisture, keeps weeds at bay, and encourages lawn mowers and string trimmers to stay away from the base of trees and shrubs. But, there can be too much of a good thing. Plants want 2-3 inches of mulch, and no more. Mulch can take two, three, or more years to break down, so if mulch is being added each spring as part of the annual maintenance, there is likely more than is needed. Excess mulch can starve tree roots of oxygen and create a place for insects and disease to attack the base of a tree.

PRUNING is different for different shrubs. Some shrubs are pruned into hedges and may be pruned one or more times each growing season. Other shrubs and trees are pruned to keep them away from buildings or sidewalks. Late fall and early winter can be a good time to do most of this type of pruning. For flowering shrubs, it is recommended to prune immediately after flowering so that the most blooms can return the next year. Have an arborist evaluate and address any issues with large trees every three to four years. One can find local certified arborists at www.treesaregood.org. This website is maintained by a professional organization that oversees certified arborists.

soll is the foundation for trees and where the tree gets its nutrients and water, it is generally not recommended to fertilize trees. If trees are mulched or located in grassy areas that are getting fertilized, the trees are receiving sufficient fertility. Knowing the pH of your soil may be helpful to reduce stress on trees. A soil test can help one determine the pH of the soil and then this can be compared to the ideal pH for the type of tree in the garden. Needed pH changes can be made with lime or sulfur.

Take some time this autumn to check in with your trees and shrubs. A little care and attention will pay dividends for years to come with shade, flowers, and beautiful fall colors.
